I'm confused about this part of the post "The closure includes donations of reusable goods. Household hazardous waste, electronic waste and other materials are still being accepted onsite" Does this mean you ARE accepting donations?

It seems this could be a good time to reopen in some capacity given that

- 1. people have been spring cleaning up a storm and ready to donate;
- 2. there are people rarin' to go back to thrifting/collecting;
- 3. there are newly in-need people economically affected by COVID-19 layoffs who will need back to school items for kids soon, recycling money, and new items for those who've had to move out/in to new places (I know of several!);
- 4. I imagine the employees who kept it open are eager to keep *their* jobs too, and adding 11 more people to the COVID-19 economic casualties would be an undesirable stain on the agency's resume;
- 5. people are very community minded right now and are seeing their help have immediate impact donating/receiving foods, goods, and standing up for social awareness and responsibility related to COVID-19, to the need for social, racial and economic equality, to

caring for the environment. The LCM is part of a program that teachers and residents can use to highlight how people make a difference.

Per "Last Chance Mercantile" on FB: "I am confirming what our District Engineer David Ramirez has said in the comments - the store is not closing permanently. We are delaying the opening at this time to assess how to operate in a financially viable way. We were not able to do this with current Covid-19 safety measures, which we wanted to implement effectively to protect public health."

Goodwill stores have recently opened with limited hours and I've personally seen both donators and shoppers chomping at the bit to go back. I've seen people in the store socially distance with masks.






