Summary

Requesting 2 rate increases:

- 5% disposal fee increase for certain material types
- \$5 per ton increase to MRF Processing Fee charged for processing Single Stream Recyclables (SSR)
 - For purposes of rate smoothing, 7 Franchise Agreement jurisdictions were not charged this fee in first year (current FY)

Purpose of rate increases:

- Catch up with 2 years of inflation costs
- Keep pace with on-going regulatory mandates
- Reflect actual cost of MRF operations
- Help off-set anticipated District revenue shortfall due to COVID-19

Customer impact:

- Combined increases estimated to average:
 - ~4.4% for 7 FA jurisdictions
 - ~1% for Monterey County + City of Monterey
 - ~5% for Self-Haul customers
- Average District customer rates will continue to be lower than most other Northern California communities




Recent benchmarking shows District rates are favorable to ratepayers

- District's total waste management system costs on a per-ton basis are the lowest among similar systems in Northern California.
- Customer garbage and recycling bills vary widely from city to city. On average, the District's residents and businesses pay the lowest rates for solid waste services.
- MRWMD's disposal rates (tip fees) are the second lowest in the region.

Breakdown of solid waste system costs






Commercial - 3yd Bin 1x/week





Residential curbside collection rates in Monterey County and other nearby communities




