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California Goals for EV Charging Stations

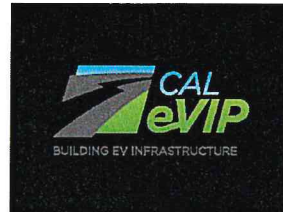
California Energy Commission investments in electric vehicle charging infrastructure support the Governor's goal of getting 1.5 million ZEVs on California roads by 2025.

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CAL eVIP Incentive Program



The California Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project (CALeVIP) offers incentives for the purchase and installation of electric vehicle charging infrastructure at publicly accessible sites throughout California.



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Project Awards

- CAL eVIP Award of up to \$40,000 eligible costs for installation of 4 – 10 EV Charging Stations (District plans are for 4 or 5)
- Central Coast Incentive Program – MBARD-ChargePoint Partner Program Award of ~\$25,000 for eligible EV Charging Station Equipment
