

## The Monterey Regional Waste Management District

The MRWMD is home to the Recycling Drop-off Center, Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, Materials Recovery Facility (the regional recycling facility), Monterey Peninsula Landfill, and renewable energy projects. We have designed our operations to make it convenient for you to reduce, reuse, recycle, and properly dispose of your household hazardous materials before refuse is deposited in the landfill. The Board of Directors and employees of the District thank you for doing your part to reduce waste and conserve resources.

The MRWMD service area includes Moss Landing, Castroville, Marina, Seaside, Del Rey Oaks, Sand City, Monterey, Monterey-Salinas Highway area, Pacific Grove, Pebble Beach, Carmel, Unincorporated Carmel, Carmel Valley, Carmel Highlands, and Big Sur.

## Recycling Drop-off

Items accepted at the free Recycling Drop-off include: mixed paper including newspapers, magazines, soft covered books, and shredded paper (bagged in clear plastic bags); cardboard; glass bottles and jars; plastic bottles and containers #1, #2, #5; large rigid plastics; metal containers; and scrap metal including water heaters. ## Household Hazardous Waste

California law prohibits the disposal of HHW in the trash. Residents within the MRWMD service area may bring household hazardous waste (HHW), free of charge, for proper and safe disposal. HHW includes household batteries, paint, pesticides, motor oil, car batteries, pool chemicals, CFL bulbs, aerosols, acids, fuels, and caustics. ## Electronics Recycling

It is against the law to dispose of electronics in the trash. Recycling helps preserve the precious contained resources for new products. Electronic devices are accepted for recycling at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility free of charge. See [whatgoeswhere.info](http://whatgoeswhere.info) for acceptance information.

## Small Business Hazardous Waste

Hazardous and regulated waste from small businesses, such as fluorescent light bulbs, paint, cleaning chemicals, etc. is accepted by appointment only. Call 831-264-6386 for an appointment or for more information. A small business processing fee applies.

### All loads subject to hazardous waste load checking.

Hazardous and other prohibited materials, as defined under California law and regulations, may not be disposed at the Monterey Peninsula Landfill or the Materials Recovery Facility. If hazardous materials are found in loads, the hauler is responsible for all costs associated with management of the hazardous material. In addition, the District may notify state and local regulatory agencies, and the responsible party or parties may be subject to civil or criminal prosecution, or both.

## FOR YOUR SAFETY

Safety guidelines when visiting MRWMD:

- Secure and tarp all incoming and outgoing loads.
- Dress for safety: gloves, pants, work boots, long sleeves. No open-toed shoes, flip-flops or shorts.
- No smoking in the facilities.
- Children and pets must remain inside vehicles at the Landfill, MRF, and all recycling drop-off areas.
- Always wait for the MRWMD staff to direct you to a safe dumping zone.
- Always remain within 6 feet of your vehicle on the Landfill and MRF tipping floor and watch for other vehicles.
- Obey all posted stop signs, safety and speed limit signs.

## Sustainable Landscape Products

## Current Disposal Fees\*

Effective July 1, 2021

### ALL LOADS MUST BE PROPERLY TARPED AND/OR SECURED

Vehicles arriving at the landfill with loads that are not properly secured are subject to a surcharge of double the disposal fee. Uncovered trucks are one of the primary sources of litter found along our roadways. <b>SOLID WASTE</b> (Basic Rate)	\$65	\$20
<b>CLEAN GREEN YARD WASTE AND WOOD WASTE</b> Unpainted wood and "clean green" yard waste only. <i>No garbage or debris, no treated or painted wood, cedar shakes, palm tree or fronds, ice-plant, cactus or poison oak. Sod may also be accepted at this rate.</i>	\$42	\$10
<b>CLEAN DRYWALL</b> (Gypsum wall board)	\$30	\$7
<b>CLEAN CONCRETE/BRICK/ROCK</b>	\$1	\$5
<b>MIXED LOADS OF CONCRETE AND ASPHALT</b>	\$2	\$5
<b>CLEAN OVERSIZED CONCRETE</b> (Up to 42 inch length, or concrete w/rebar or pipe less than 8 inches exposed.)	\$10	\$10
<b>CLEAN ASPHALT</b>	\$1	\$5
<b>FOOD SCRAPS</b> <i>Clean loads of food scraps, cannabis and certified compostable products from pre-approved generators and/or venues, events.</i>	\$57	\$15
<b>APPLIANCES WITHOUT REFRIGERANT</b>		\$5/ea
<b>APPLIANCES WITH REFRIGERANT</b>		\$20/ea
<b>ELECTRONIC WASTE</b> (e.g. Televisions, Computers, Microwaves, Etc.) Must be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste area for recycling. <i>It is illegal to dispose of electronic waste items in the trash. They are accepted for recycling. Deliver your TVs and monitors before arriving at the scale.</i>		NO CHARGE
<b>MATTRESS/BOX SPRING</b> - Residents may bring 5 or fewer units from their home.		NO CHARGE
<b>MATTRESS/BOX SPRING</b> - Commercial haulers will be charged per mattress and box spring.		\$5/ea
<b>STUMPS</b>		
Diameter 2 - 3 feet in any dimension, will be charged \$10 each in addition to the yard waste rate per ton	\$40	+\$10/ea
Diameter 3 - 5 feet in any dimension, will be charged \$50 each in addition to the solid waste rate per ton	\$62	+\$50/ea
Diameter greater than 5 feet in any dimension, will be charged \$50 each in addition to the problem waste rate per ton	\$95	+\$50/ea
<b>TIRES</b> (For more than 3 tires, the per-tire rate is in addition to the solid waste rate. Waste Tire Hauler Certification & Manifest are required for disposal of 10 or more tires.)

Declared, it will be charged at the basic solid waste rate, plus service fee per load	\$65/ton + \$50 service fee	
Undeclared, entire load will be charged the problem waste rate, plus service fee per load	\$95/ton + \$50 service fee

<b>SPECIAL WASTE REQUIRING PRE-APPROVAL</b>		
Acceptance of the following materials requires advance approval from MRWMD staff, and may require analytical analysis and a service fee. The use of belly dumps requires prior District approval and may be subject to a special handling fee of \$20 per truck.
