Christmas Trees

Recycle curbside after the holidays. Remove all decorations, lights, and stands. No flocked trees. Please check with your service provider for details and collection dates. MRWMD also offers free drop-off Dec 27-Jan 15.

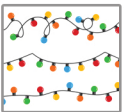
Gift Wrapping

Wrapping paper and boxes without foil, plastic lining or packaging accepted in curbside recycling and the MRWMD recycling drop-off. Remove tape, ribbon and decoration. Gift bags not accepted. Please reuse or donate.



Electronics

Recycle your old and broken electronics (TVs, computers, microwaves, etc.) for free at MRWMD's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, M-Sat, 9am-4pm. Can't transport? Contact your service provider about bulky item collection.



Holiday Lights

Broken string lights can be brought to the MRWMD Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility for recycling through January. If in working condition, donate to the Last Chance Mercantile.



Household Batteries

Batteries start fires; keep them out of the cart. To recycle them curbside, place in a clear, sealed plastic bag **on top of your blue recycling cart**; also at MRWMD's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, M-Sat, 9am-4pm.



Food Scraps

As of January 1, recycle food scraps and become part of the solution to climate change. It's easy. Put your unpackaged food scraps (including trimmings, plate scrapings, bones, shells—**just not raw meat, liquids, and no plastic, metal, glass or paper**) into your green cart for weekly curbside collection. Used Cooking Oil

Frying turkeys? Drop off up to 15 gallons of cooking oil at MRWMD's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. GreenWaste Recovery customers can request a "Used Oil Recovery Kit" to recycling curbside.
