# SB 1383 Edible Food Recovery Program - Grant Funding Opportunity, FY 22-23

# **Summary of Funding**

This grant is intended to expand and enhance edible food recovery programs at food rescue organizations and services operating within the Monterey County region to better accommodate state mandates and broaden community operations. This grant is designed to:

- 1. Help increase the capacity of local food rescue organizations and services operating within the County of Monterey.
- 2. Assist local food recovery organizations and services by funding the purchase of equipment, materials, and supplies that will increase the total pounds of edible food an organization or service is able to recover and distribute to those in need.
- 3. Improve our region's ability to respond to and comply with SB 1383 mandates by increasing capacity, thereby allowing businesses to donate the maximum amount of edible food that would otherwise be disposed of.
- 4. Ensure food safety as edible food recovery capacity and donations increase.

#### **State Mandate**

# Senate Bill 1383 - Short-Lived Climate Pollutants SB 1383

SB 1383 establishes the following primary targets:

- 1. Achieve 50% reduction in statewide organic disposal from 2014 levels by 2020.
- 2. Achieve 75% reduction in statewide organic disposal from 2014 levels by 2025.
- 3. Recover for human consumption a minimum of 20% of edible food that would otherwise be disposed by 2025

#### **Preface**

The SB 1383 Edible Food Recovery Program - Grant Funding Opportunity, FY 22-23 intends to award a total of up to \$100,000 to non-profit organizations, businesses, or public entities that collect, generate, and distribute food to those in need and charities within the County of Monterey. Applicants must operate within the service areas of Salinas Valley Recycles (SVR)\*or ReGen Monterey\*\*. The award will strengthen current food rescue programs in order to better comply with California edible food waste recovery laws.

\*The **Salinas Valley Recycles** service area includes: Gonzales, Greenfield, King City, Salinas, or Soledad.

\*\*ReGen Monterey includes: Carmel-by-the-Sea, Del Rey Oaks, Marina, Monterey, Pacific Grove, Seaside, Sand City, Pebble Beach Community Services District, and Unincorporated Monterey County.

Organizations may request a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$20,000. We anticipate the average award to be between \$5,000 and \$10,000. This grant does not require matching funds or cost-share, but it is highly recommended. Additional funding may be allocated in future years to further bolster the region's ability to prevent edible food waste. Funds may be used by awarded recipients for qualified expenditures listed in the awardees approved budget and in line with grant requirements. A minimum of 2 quotes for requested expenditures are required when making this application. By contract, all purchases made using the grant must be reported to ensure proper use of funds and must include valid documentation with time-stamped receipts.

Applicants will submit proposals based on individual organization needs. Examples of eligible expenses include the following:

Shelving Units Refrigeration Units Freezer Units

Kitchen Supplies Food Preservation Supplies Food Recovery Vehicles

Staffing/Wages

Ineligible expenses include any items that do not directly increase food rescue capacity for the individual organization.

Award payments will be made upfront with checks issued by October 11th, 2022.

# **Eligibility Requirements**

Any non-profit organization, business, or public entity operating within the selected area that collects and/or distributes recovered edible food for public need. Selected areas include the following:

<u>Salinas Valley Recycles:</u> City of Gonzales, City of Greenfield, King City, City of Salinas, or City of Soledad.

**ReGen Monterey**: City of Carmel-by-the-Sea, City of Del Rey Oaks, City of Marina, City of Monterey, City of Pacific Grove, City of Seaside, or Sand City, Pebble Beach Community Services District, or Unincorporated Monterey County.

Organizations selected for funding from the Edible Food Recovery Pilot Grant, FY 21/22, are not eligible for funding from this grant (Edible Food Recovery Grant Program, FY 22/23).

### **Applicant Requirements**

- Applicants must fill out and submit a W9 in order to receive any awarded funds.
- Applicants must submit a minimum of 2 quotes for requested expenditures along with their application.
- Applicants must maintain current Food Safety handlers certification and appropriate required permits.
- Applicants must be in good standing with SVR and ReGen Monterey.
- Applicants must track and report project results. Results will be summarized in a Final Report due by June 30, 2023: Projects results include but are not limited to:
  - Accounting and documentation for actual expenditures made in line with approved grant funding.
  - Quantify increased capacity in the form of increased numbers of pounds of food collected, pounds of food distributed, individuals served, meals served, square feet of storage, etc.
  - Changes in disposal: reduced disposal of spoiled food, increased/added organics diversion.
  - Other results and outcomes related to the approved project scope.

# **Eligible Expenses**

#### **Prioritized Eligible Expenses:**

Equipment, materials, or supplies to increase safe food recovery, preparation, preservation (canning, vacuum sealing, jamming, ect.), handling, storage, and/or transportation of food donations to/from donating parties, audiences served, and related activities.

#### Also Eligible:

- Staff time and activities to support project coordination, training, outreach, education, tracking, or reporting associated with the proposed project.
- Vehicles and refrigerated vehicles.
- Equipment and/or installation/upgrading of safe food storage or refrigeration infrastructure and systems (e.g. walk-in refrigerators).

#### **Ineligible Expenses:**

- The purchase or leasing of buildings or properties.
- Food (perishable or nonperishable)

# **Application Submission**

Proposal applications must be submitted by 5:00pm on **September 16th, 2022**. Applications must be submitted via email. A confirmation message following submission will be sent. Applications received after 5:00pm on **September 16th, 2022**, will not be considered for funding.

# Recommended Timeline - EFR Grant Program FY 22/23

Based on the Edible Food Capacity Study of 2021 in tandem with the experience garnered from the ERF Pilot Grant Program (FY 21/22), the following outlines recommended action for a successful rollout of the SB 1383 Edible Food Recovery Grant Program (FY 22/23).

<b>Friday</b> , August 12th 8/12/2022	Announce renewal of the grant program and invite pantries to apply.  Applications will be open to all organizations within Monterey County who would like to apply.  Members and Agencies of the Edible Food Group will issue a notice on their websites, utilize social media and word of mouth to promote the grant opportunity.  Monterey Food Bank will be contacted, encouraged to apply, and encouraged to alert organizations to the opportunity.  BSE will promote the program, as well as work with organizations to ensure complete and accurate applications over the next month. Evaluation of submitted applications will again be overseen by a BSE employee who has not had direct contact with pantries regarding their application.	
Friday, September 16th 9/16/2022	Due date for applications, price quotes, and W9 forms.  Applications received after this date will not be considered for grant funding.	
<b>Monday</b> , October 10th 10/3/2022	Announce award recipients and alert selected organizations.  Send out finalized contracts along with the award announcement.  Ask recipients to return contracts by <b>October 18th, 2022</b> .	
<b>Tuesday</b> , October 18th 10/18/2022	Issue funding checks.  Grant term begins.
